Athletic Director's Report — AD Regina Grubb shared PHS had a great fall. Cross County went to States. Boys had a State Champion and Girls had a State finalist. Golf had District Champions, Regional and State Champions. They won by 2 strokes. Olivia Cong was and Individual State Champion. Girls Soccer were Division Champions for the 2nd year. Lizzie Kovacs, Marissa Edwards and Avery Penn were selected for the Senior County Game which was a nice ending. Football had 7 wins and 3 losses. They were first seat for playoff and had a bye. Lots of injuries. Girls Volleyball had a great season and lost to Hammond in 5 sets and each 2-3 points and was very close. Field Hockey. Lauren Hopkins was 1st team for goalie, Phoebe Snelson was 1st team for defense. Boys Soccer had 2 boys — Sampson Yeagher and Josh Martinez — selected for Senior County Game. Eighty percent of athletes received the Minds of Motion with an average GPA of 3.54 which was tremendous.

To kick off winter season — track, swim and wrestling are starting now, all 4 basketball teams (GV, GJV, BV, BJV) won their first games. Turn out for tryouts was excellent with 290 register for winter tryouts. Boys basketball had 50 students which was the largest. Wrestling is still looking for athletes.

The fundraiser is happening again. We are on a Tier 1 safety and will continue this Fall. We will use student IDs to get in and keep them off the floor. Students have escorted the parking. Asking student to clean up after themselves.

Poms County Competition is 2/4.


Grubb is working with Booster for winter.

### **OPEN FORUM - Questions**

• Kamilla Feys asked If JV uniforms can be replaced with extra money as well as Varsity for football? She felt like we should not sit on money when we have this situation. Grubb responded that she coordinates with coaches to choose and gets 18 uniforms in various sizes for teams that are next in line in the every 4 years rotation. JV gets old uniforms from V that are passed down. She chose uniforms with coaches. For example, basketball has Under Armor which was \$4200 about for home and away jerseys and shorts. \$10,000 -\$12,000 for football. Gina will look at football jerseys and

Varsity to see if they need to be replaced. Griffiths are sympathetic to the uniform struggle and Varsity ones were way too big for JV players last year.

- There was a motion to do an analysis to see if we can rotate uniforms every 2-3 years instead of 4 years. Gina will order Fall 2023 in the next few months.
- Member asked to do a school store the has singlets included like an apparel store and families could buy? Gina responded that we should have enough singlets in Wrestling. Wrestling just ordered and got 10 extra singlets but to ones that were not returned previously. Gina suggested that you talk to the coach if you need more and they will reach out to her. Team parent can do a blast email.
- Member asked about getting warm ups and alternative uniforms on their own? And if
  we could send a survey out to families? Gina responded that PHS Athletics can't buy
  items for families that they keep and are personalized only ones the school keeps.
  For example, men's volleyball buys own warm ups with names on the back that they
  keep and are not returned.
- We are a 2A school and whoever registered the student receives information.
- Member asked why some larger schools have trainers and we had a problem with 3 GSOCC players getting injured at the last game and why no trainer? Trainer Issue remains a problem with too few.
- Member asked if Bocce get a bus? Gina responded that the Bus is up to the coach if they want one. Many sports carpool. Parents have not received information about buses yet — just students
